Bus Pass



- A flyer on how to apply can be found in your enrolment pack. It looks like this
- You are required to apply online
- The application can be done now
- When you do apply, remember to use the student's name and not yours 🕄
- Print the application certificate as this can be used as a bus pass until bus passes are sent out
- The bus pass will be sent to the school and we will hand it to the students.

Rural and regional school travel

Apply online for free school travel in rural and regional NSW. You only need to complete one form, even for journeys using more than one operator.

Who can apply?

To be eligible for free school travel, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

Years K-2 (Infants) These is no minimum distance.

Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km wolking.

Years 7-12 (Secondary) More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking

Who needs to apply

You only need to apply if the student has never been approved for free school travel before. Students in a shared parential responsibility situation (e.g. joint curitady) should submit a separate application for both addresses.

How to update your details

You need to up date student details an line if the student is changing their nome, address, school ar campus, or their franspart operator. You can update them at a partonesport.new.gov.ow's staf splate details# up date Det alls

Frequently asked questions Does the approved free travel include travel

Does the approved free travel include travel outside school hours?

Approved free school brovel is only for travel to and from school. So for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays, students will need to buy a blowt

What if them's no public transport in my area?

In areas where there is no public transport, you may be able to get a subelay for driving the student to school. For details, visit transportnew.info/school-students

How do I apply if the student needs to travel from two addresses because the parents live separately?

Each parent (or the student if aged 16 or over) needs to apply separately for each address. The same minimum distances apply.

How to apply for free travel for the first time

You can apply for free school travel for most year from the start of Term 4 this year.

Step 1

Once you have enrolled your child at the new school, apply online by giving your home address and balling us which bus company the subdent needs to travel with between home and school. You can apply online at appartaneoport.com.gov.ou/sate/someW how ToApply

Step 2

The school then confirms to us that your details are correct.

Step 3

We will then work an your application. You will get an ernal confirming if the student's approved for free trave. If two, we will stall your local buc company who may send a school travel pars (if needed) to your school or, in some cases, the buc company will contact you school whech yo buc travel amongements.

A parent or guardian must apply for students aged 15 years and under. Students who are 16 years and over must apply for themselves.
