Introducing our new Deputy Principal Mr Simon Flanigan

Mr Simon Flanigan started at Vincentia High at the beginning of this term in the role of Deputy Principal (DP) Years 7 & 10. He has worked for the Department of Education for 14 years as a teacher, Head Teacher Science and Relieving Deputy Principal at Leumeah High School in Western Sydney. Our Principal Mr Ken Bates came from the same high school, Mr Flanigan and he worked closely together on many programs at Leumeah and have a strong working relationship. "It is so important to have a good Principal and leader" said Mr Flanigan.

One of Mr Flanigan's first tasks is to put systems in place so that all staff are working together towards the same goal of lifting academia for all students and making Vincentia High the school of first choice in the area.

Prior to teaching Mr Flanigan worked in the building trade and studied Mechanical Engineering. He then decided on a career change to bring about new challenges and rewards.

He came to Sussex Inlet as a child for holidays and Shoalhaven Heads as a teenager, so he is familiar with the South Coast and excited to be living here.

Kokoda Track was tougher than expected!

Jeremy Head (Vice-Captain) travelled to Papua New Guinea in the school holidays as part of the Kokoda Youth Leadership Challenge. Jeremy won a sponsorship through Sussex Inlet RSL Club and set out, with other students, to tackle the Kokoda Track.

In preparation for the gruelling trek, Jeremy set himself an extensive training regime, however nothing could have prepared him for the endless hours of walking through the unforgiving terrain of the Kokoda Track. Jeremy explains, "I was expecting the trek to be difficult but it was even tougher than I had thought. Walking down the slippery slopes put a huge amount of pressure on your ankles. The continuous walking whilst carrying 21kg was also challenging. The heat was bad too. At first I was not acclimatised and would sweat a lot, but after a few days it got better."

Most days began at 4.00 am when the group would pack up their tents and have breakfast. During this time, Jeremy would mentally prepare himself for the 20km trek ahead. "The mental challenge of the trek was more difficult than the physical challenge. Many of the students were not physically fit and found the trek extremely difficult. I had trained for the trek but had developed huge blisters on my feet. I had to push myself to keep going."

When asked about how the Kokoda Youth Leadership Challenge has changed him, Jeremy said that it was difficult to put into words. Learning about the stories of the Australians who fought on the Kokoda Track was particularly moving for Jeremy, as was the experience of walking in the footsteps of his great-grandfathers who had served there. No doubt on the Remembrance Day Jeremy will be reflecting on his experiences on the Kokoda Track and the 625 Australians who died there.

2019 Premier's Teacher Scholarship awarded to Ms Joura

Ms Joura is 1 of 20 highly talented and dedicated teachers from across NSW to be recognised for her commitment to quality education with a 2019 Premier's Teacher Scholarship. The Premier's History Teachers Association History Scholarship will provide a unique opportunity for Ms Joura to undertake an international and Australian study tour to Perth, Denmark and the United Kingdom for 5 weeks next April. During the tour Ms Joura will visit some of the world's most innovative schools and centres of education.

Her focus will be on incorporating maritime archaeology into the history curriculum through the use of shipwreck case studies and hands on activities. Of particular interest is the battle between Sydney (II) and Kormoran during WW2, the Dutch trading ship Batavia and Viking wrecks in Europe.

The Premier of NSW Gladys Berejiklian MP congratulated Ms Joura on her success as a recipient of the scholarship. This program is about helping to make the best teachers in NSW reach their full potential and support their peers.

Ms Joura was inspired to become a history teacher form her days as a high school student and she hopes to return with some new ideas and invigorating ways to further enrich the educational needs of her students and colleagues.





Students Based Apprenticeships or Traineeships (SBATS)

SBATS are available to all Year 10, 11 and 12 high school students in NSW. They allow students to commence an apprenticeship or complete a traineeship while at school. A School Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship combines paid work, training and school; and an industry recognised national qualification that will gain credit towards the HSC.


